ST THERESE JUSTICE, ECOLOGY AND PEACE GROUP

For Pope Leo, as for Francis before him, care for creation is framed as justice and environmental protection is an essential part of Christian life. Already, Leo has celebrated the first-ever liturgy under a new Vatican-approved Mass for the Care of Creation and issued his message for the 2025 World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation, celebrated 1 September. He has spent part of the summer at the papal villa in Castel Gandalfo, and paid visits to the Borgo Laudato Si' sustainable ecology area established by Francis. He also has toured the land where the Vatican is constructing a vast solar farm capable of fully powering Vatican City and making it the first carbon-neutral nation.

In 2015, Pope Francis wrote that "charity and mercy demand that the Church, like a good mother, be near her children who feel themselves estranged from her." The Interdiocesan Tribunal of Sydney, which has an Office in the Diocese of Wollongong, is a service of the Church to assist with the pastoral care of Catholics and non-Catholics who are civilly divorced, and who are seeking to remarry or who want clarification of their standing in the Church. The Tribunal also assists remarried persons seeking to have their current marriage recognised in the Church, and remarried persons wishing to be baptised or received into the Catholic Church. Any divorced person, or a divorced and remarried person is welcome to contact the Wollongong Office of the Tribunal to obtain further information, or to have their status within the Church clarified. 


Gospel : Luke 13:22-30
