MESSAGE FROM FR DUANE



I wish to extend my deepest gratitude to all involved in the Pentecost Multicultural Mass last Sunday – those who prepared it behind the scenes, those who shared prayers in

language, those who dressed in traditional dress, the St Therese school community for their attendance and leading the final song, those who brought delicious food for after Mass, our regular ministers for their usual ministry as well as their flexibility, and all of our regular parishioners for your openness to the uniqueness of the celebration. It was a wonderful celebration of the cultural diversity that we are so blessed to enjoy in our parish, and of the bond of unity we share through Christ in the Holy Spirit!

While I am often reluctant to single out any particular group, there are a few reasons why I wish to make special mention of our Burmese community at this time. A number of people commented on how deeply moved they were by the reflection hymn prepared and sung so beautifully by the Burmese community. When we consider the journey that so many of our Burmese parishioners have made as refugees fleeing oppression and violence, it was even more deeply moving to witness the faith, courage and joy that they radiate so beautifully among us. As many of you would know, a terrible earthquake occurred in March this year in Myanmar, with aftershocks continuing even to this week, adding to the struggles of many in Myanmar, including loved ones of our

own Burmese parishioners. We will have opportunities in our parish to provide practical support to the Burmese community in the coming months and I look forward to sharing more details with you of this as they come to hand. For now, I share with you the English translation of the hymn they sang, which I pray will continue to inspire all of us in whatever difficulties we face in life:

As I walk through the troubled world, you protect me. Even in the presence of enemies, you love and give me your flesh and blood at the table.

If God is in my life, all things will be fulfilled. My soul will be joyful and praise God's glory.

When I was in pain and suffering, you warmed my heart. When darkness reigned, I could not see, you were a lamp to see on the path.

As I have fallen many times in the path of sin, you have always forgiven me.

You have promised me a place of refuge in heaven, a refuge for my believing soul.

CAR PARK UPDATE: GATHERING SAFELY AFTER MASS. Thank you to everyone for your co-operation with the new line-marking in the car park. We can't do parish renewal alone. No one person has all the gifts and strengths needed to single-handedly lead, let alone transform, a parish. There is no such thing as a balanced person, but you can have a balanced team. — Fr James Mallon

Everyone knows at least one person who has served in a parish for years, sometimes decades. When that person inevitably moves on or passes away, there is a momentary panic as we all scramble to find someone, anyone, to do the thing that they used to do. When we give tasks, we create workers. When we share responsibility and authority, we empower leaders. This creates ownership, commitment and passion. Everyone is called to lead, each in their own sphere of influence. So, what are we looking for in parish leaders? And how do we lead in a way that continues to empower new leaders? This formation will explore the basics of what it means to be an empowering leader and how that can help you discover untapped potential and talent in your community.

What is the Formation Pathway?
