This weekend, with the Church throughout the world we celebrate the "Jubilee of the Sick and Health Care Workers". We remember with thanksgiving the nurses and doctors in our health system who I have regularly seen attend to the sick and dying with the utmost care and compassion. We remember also the many people who lovingly care for their sick and aged family members, often behind the scenes. We thank God for the ministry of Communion to the sick and housebound that enables our sick parishioners to remain spiritually united with us though they can no longer physically attend Mass. Above all, we pray for the sick, that they may know the healing mercy of Jesus, our Saviour, and the peace and hope that only he can give – especially through the prayers of the Church and the support of health care workers and loved ones.

Finally, we are planning to commence a new **high school youth initiative** in Term 2 called "Youth Alpha". This will be a joint initiative of West Wollongong and Unanderra parishes, on Saturday evenings 7pm-8:30pm at St Therese Parish Centre West Wollongong, with food, followed by a fun and engaging video, and small group reflection on life and faith where every young person will feel welcome, safe and respected.

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Philippians

I believe nothing can happen that will outweigh the supreme advantage of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. For him I have accepted the loss of everything, and I look on everything as so much rubbish if only I can have Christ and be given a place in him. I am no longer trying for perfection by my own efforts, the perfection that comes from the Law, but I want only the perfection that comes through faith in Christ, and is from God and based on faith. All I want is to know Christ and the power of his resurrection and to share his sufferings by reproducing the pattern of his death. That is the way I can hope to take my place in the resurrection of the dead. Not that I have become perfect yet: I have not yet won, but I am still running, trying to capture the prize for which Christ Jesus captured me. I can assure you my brothers, I am far from thinking that I have already won. All I can say is that I forget the past and I strain ahead for what is still to come; I am racing for the finish, for the prize to which God calls us upwards to receive in Christ Jesus.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John
